

Dear Students and Colleagues,

FIGHTING COVID-19 Denied Entry for High-risk Persons and Mask Law

In view of the upsurge in COVID-19 cases and the Government's announcement today on the mask law, students and staff members are reminded to observe campus access control strictly and complete the health declaration carefully with attention to potential risks arising from the people you have met and places you have visited.

You **MUST NOT ENTER CAMPUS** if, in the past 14 days, you have had close contact with one of the following three categories of people:

- **A confirmed COVID-19 case, or**
- **A person undergoing compulsory quarantine, or**
- **A person required by the HKSAR Government or a doctor to take COVID-19 test.**

You **MUST NOT ENTER CAMPUS** if you have any COVID-like symptoms, or you have been required to take COVID-19 test.

You **MUST WEAR A MASK AT ALL TIMES** while on campus. The only exceptions are

- when you are seated inside your private office, or,
- when, in an open-plan office, you are seated and stationed inside your own cubicle that is enclosed on three sides by partitions well taller than the person in the seated position.

As the number of confirmed cases is still rising in the community, more and more people will be required to take the COVID-19 test. In this regard, please exercise care, and you should find out whenever practicable whether you have had close contact with the three categories of people set out above, including those who have lived or dined with you, or stayed in the same confined space during which social distancing and mask rule were defied.

These exceptionally stringent measures aim to protect yourself, your fellow students and your colleagues. They also serve as a reminder to individuals to be vigilant and act responsibly.

Any false declaration or misrepresentation of facts in the health declaration is considered a serious misconduct that is subject to disciplinary action by the University.
