Dear Students and Colleagues,

Update on Health Declaration

The University has been closely monitoring the COVID-19 pandemic situation and reviewing the prevailing campus access control measures. The Government has recently imposed multiple compulsory COVID-19 tests on persons that might be at risks. In response to this, the University has assessed and decided that students or staff who have obtained negative results for their first compulsory COVID-19 test will not be banned from access to campus even if they are still required to carry out further compulsory tests.

The health declaration of campus access control will be updated with effect from 15 September 2021 (Wednesday). The changes are highlighted in bold.

Student / staff member will NOT be allowed to enter the campus if he / she:

1. is currently under compulsory quarantine by the HKSAR Government; or
2. is currently required by the HKSAR Government or a doctor to undergo compulsory COVID-19 test EXCEPT
 - a. compulsory precautionary COVID-19 testing (including compulsory testing for specified occupations or persons working at specified business and premises), or
 - b. subsequent compulsory COVID-19 testing after negative result of compulsory testing (including inbound travellers and 2nd or later tests of “persons subject to compulsory testing” under Cap. 599J); or
3. in the last 14 days, has been in close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case or a person who is either
 - a. currently undergoing compulsory quarantine, or
 - b. currently required by the HKSAR Government or a doctor to undergo compulsory COVID-19 test EXCEPT

- i. compulsory precautionary COVID-19 testing (including compulsory testing for specified occupations or persons working at specified business and premises), or
 - ii. subsequent compulsory COVID-19 testing after negative result of compulsory testing (including inbound travellers and 2nd or later tests of “persons subject to compulsory testing” under Cap. 599J); or
4. has any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, fatigue, cough, diarrhoea, vomiting and flu-like symptoms.
